We are extremely proud of our 2022 graduates who have continued to move forward with their educational goals in spite of many challenges they may have faced. Each has set clear goals as they continue to work towards bright and promising futures.

It's that time of year where we celebrate graduation as one of the most significant rites of passage in a young person's life! This is a particularly big accomplishment for youth coming out of foster care, as the odds are not in their favor. Only 50% of youth in foster care graduate from high school, and just 3% obtain a 4-year college degree. Unfortunately for foster youth, the financial resources, mentorship, support, stability, and guidance needed to complete postsecondary education or training programs are not common, resulting in these low numbers.

At SOS Children's Villages Florida, we help our young people defy the odds with a 100% high school graduation rate, and 85% go on to receive some form of secondary education. These results are achieved through the support of our Next Steps program providing a continuum of services for young adults who have aged out of care.
